## About CashBack for Communities

CashBack for Communities is a Scottish Government programme which takes funds recovered from the proceeds of crime and invests them into free activities and programmes for young people across Scotland. Inspiring Scotland is the delivery partner for the CashBack for Communities programme, appointed in July 2012.

- CashBack invests monies seized from criminals under the Proceeds of Crime Act 2002 back into our communities.
- Since 2008 the Scottish Government has committed £92 million to CashBack / community initiatives, funding community activities and facilities largely, but not exclusively, for young people.
- CashBack supports all 32 Local Authorities across Scotland.
- Sporting and recreational activities / culture / mentoring and employability / community projects.
- CashBack has delivered nearly 2 million activities and opportunities for young people.
- Phase 3 of CashBack runs to end March 2017 and is focused on positive outcomes for young people.



# CashBack for Communities: Aims

CashBack activities:

- Use the proceeds of crime in a positive way to expand young people's horizons and increase their opportunities to develop their interests and skills in an enjoyable, fulfilling and supportive way.
- Are open, where possible, to all children and young people, while focusing resources in those communities suffering most from antisocial behaviour and crime.
- Seek to increase levels of participation to help divert young people away from 'at risk' behaviour, and will aim to increase the positive long-term outcomes for those who take part.

It should be noted that CashBack partners may have worked with some of the same young people over a number of years. Therefore the total annual activity and opportunity figures might not directly correlate to the number of individual young people who have been involved with CashBack.



# Historic CashBack funding (2008 - 2016)

#### Examples of CashBack funded activities up to 2016

The **Small Grants Scheme** consortium has been a beneficiary of CashBack funding in Inverclyde since 2008 and this has included supporting Boys Brigade, Girlguiding Scotland, Scouts, Girls Brigade and Youth Club activities across the area.

**YouthLink Scotland**, through the Youth Work Fund, has supported capacity of young people and youth work organisations. Examples in the Local Authority include the funding programmes managed by CLD in Inverclyde Authority and Greenock and District Scout Group, I Youth Zone, Branchton Community Centre.

**Creative Scotland**, through their CashBack for Creativity fund, has supported many organisations in the area including Inverclyde Breakers, The Hub/Event Horizon, and Art projects with Inverclyde Council.

**Prince's Trust Development Awards** have been used to support a number of young people in the area including funding to purchase IT equipment, SIA course fees and purchasing carpentry equipment.

The **Scottish FA** manages the Midnight League programme which takes place on Friday nights at Port Glasgow High and Lady Octavia Sports Centre. Two Quality Mark Clubs who have benefited from the focussed approach to female volunteer recruitment are St Peters Football Club (Renfrewshire) and Port Glasgow Juniors (Inverclyde). Both clubs have well established boys sections but have struggled in the past to create sustainable girls participation. Port Glasgow Juniors have now increased the number of female players by 32 since the beginning of 2012.

**Scottish Rugby Union** runs broad participation activities in Inverclyde and the CashBack funding is used to part-fund one full-time and one part time rugby club Development Officer at Greenock Wanderers RFC. Both posts are responsible for the delivery of the broad participation programme, Schools of Rugby and Street Rugby in the area. The Street Rugby programme began delivery in August and continued into November with 16 sessions delivered at Lady Octavia and Greenock Wanderers RFC. In 2012 Greenock Wanderers RFC were awarded funding from the CashBack Rugby Facilities Fund for the improvement of pitch drainage to help improve the quality of the pitches accommodating the growing numbers of boys and girls playing rugby at the club.

The **Link Up** project supported by Inspiring Scotland, and the CashBack programme until 2014, facilitates, supports and evidences ways that individuals and communities can build their social connections and help and trust each other. In Inverclyde Local Authority Area were predominantly focused on the Larkfield area of the Greenock and the project host organisation was Action for Children. Key activities included: Silly Soccer (under 14 year olds), DJ Workshops (14+ years old), Women's Group, and Gardening & Fencing Group. The local Link Up worker also supported the potential development of a community gym in partnership with the local Boxing Club using equipment that has been donated to the project. In February 2013, a community exhibition was launched. This and the accompanying social media site helped to get people engaged in the Link Up project and to initiate discussions about living in the area and what people like about it.



# Inverclyde – CashBack Outcomes: Case Studies

CashBack has made a huge difference to the lives of young people. We have captured information on individual case studies for CashBack partners which demonstrate the impact delivery activities have had to those participating. **Ocean Youth Trust Scotland** provide young people a truly unique and life changing opportunity. Over the course of a very intense week, living together in close proximity they learn not only to sail but how to gain leadership skills and work effectively as part of a team. 10 young people referred by the Local Authority through activity agreement, went to sea and all had a life changing experience. Feedback from the group was positive. Indeed 8 out of 10 of the group all stated they would like to sail again as well as a number wishing to apply to become a volunteer for OYT Scotland. They all completed, as part of the exercise a Start Yachting Certificate, a level 3 SQA Core skills certificate as well as a gold award for the outward bound section of the Duke of Edinburgh awards scheme. Some quotes received from young people at the end of the journey reflected the huge impact the exercise achieved. 'one of the greatest experiences of my life'...'I have gained the ability to speak more openly in a group"...I have gained confidence on boats and being around people'.
