# About CashBack for Communities

CashBack for Communities is a Scottish Government programme which takes funds recovered from the proceeds of crime and invests them into free activities and programmes for young people across Scotland. Inspiring Scotland is the delivery partner for the CashBack for Communities programme, appointed in July 2012.

- CashBack invests monies seized from criminals under the Proceeds of Crime Act 2002 back into our communities.
- Since 2008 the Scottish Government has committed £92 million to CashBack / community initiatives, funding community activities and facilities largely, but not exclusively, for young people.
- CashBack supports all 32 Local Authorities across Scotland.
- Sporting and recreational activities / culture / mentoring and employability / community projects.
- CashBack has delivered nearly 2 million activities and opportunities for young people.
- Phase 3 of CashBack runs to end March 2017 and is focused on positive outcomes for young people.



# CashBack for Communities: Aims

CashBack activities:

- Use the proceeds of crime in a positive way to expand young people's horizons and increase their opportunities to develop their interests and skills in an enjoyable, fulfilling and supportive way.
- Are open, where possible, to all children and young people, while focusing resources in those communities suffering most from antisocial behaviour and crime.
- Seek to increase levels of participation to help divert young people away from 'at risk' behaviour, and will aim to increase the positive long-term outcomes for those who take part.

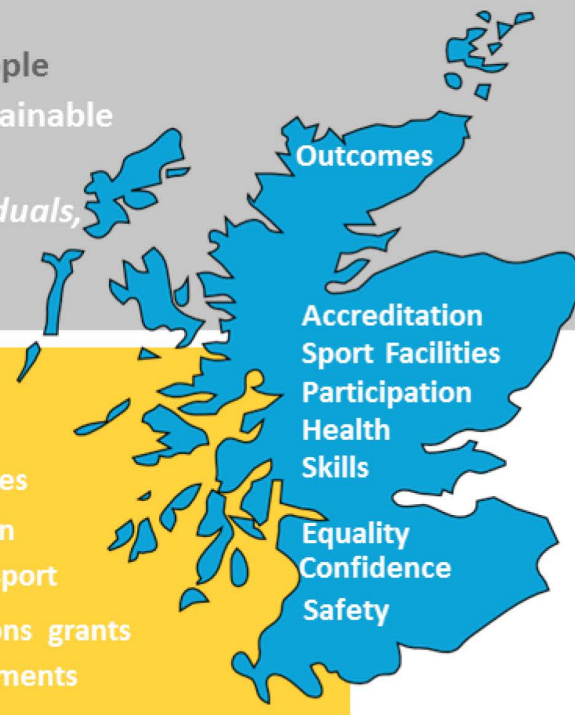

Activity number represents the number of activities and opportunities that young people have taken advantage of as a result of CashBack funding. It should be noted that CashBack partners may have worked with some of the same young people over a number of years. Therefore the total annual activity and opportunity figures might not directly correlate to the number of individual young people who have been involved with CashBack.



# Historic CashBack funding (2008 -2016)

## Examples of CashBack funded activities up to 2016

The **Small Grants Scheme** exists to support local volunteer led youth groups and a number of these have been funded through the CashBack programme in West Dunbartonshire including Scouts, Girl Guides and Boys Brigade at Clydebank, Glen Lusset and Lennox and Argyle.

**YouthLink Scotland**, through the Youth Work Fund, has supported capacity of young people and youth work organisations. Examples in the Local Authority include funding of the Unit 23 Skate Park project.

**Prince's Trust Development Awards** have been used to support a number of young people in the area including funding towards completing SIA licences, a nail tech course and hairdressing courses

**Scottish FA** runs a School of Football initiative with Vale of Leven Academy which was one of 26 schools running the project across Scotland. A social and academic programme, the pupils involved receive 1 hour per day activities within their curriculum. The SFA also manages the Midnight League programme which has run activities at Clydebank High School as well as Street football at Vale of Leven Academy.

**Scottish Rugby Union** has part funded two full time rugby Development Officers at Clydebank RFC and one at Helensburgh RFC who are responsible for delivery of broad participation programme. In 2012 Helensburgh RFC was funding to assist with pitch improvements and changing room upgrades.



# West Dunbartonshire – CashBack Outcomes: Case Studies



CashBack has made a huge difference to the lives of young people. We have captured information on individual case studies for CashBack partners which demonstrate the impact delivery activities have had to those participating. The Scottish FA has run the CashBack funded **School of Football** initiative at Vale of Leven Academy over the last few years for S1-2 pupils. Since the start of 2015 all S2 participants have had to prepare a presentation based upon their learning and experiences within the School of Football programme. This has led all participants having to research, develop and deliver an oral presentation to their peers, selected teachers and SoF staff. This has had a positive impact on the confidence of individuals within the group to be able to improve their communication skills. For the last 2 quarters of the school term the 30 pupils have all started to complete the SQA credit rated Dynamic Youth Award which is an additional element of the educational element of the programme.

A young person was a recipient of a **Prince's Trust Development Award**:

*"I heard about the Development Awards that CashBack for Communities funded through Princes Trust on Gumtree.*

*"I'd been struggling to get by and couldn't get work. I was depressed. No job and no money. Princes Trust showed me how to make a good CV, and set out my goals to get a trade.*

*"I got an award which helped me go on a building course and I have since become an Apprentice Joiner. I love it, have made good friends got to experience different trades and earned my CSCS card which helps me for any trade working on a building site.*
