About CashBack for Communities

CashBack for Communities is a Scottish Government programme which takes funds recovered from the proceeds of crime and invests them into free activities and programmes for young people across Scotland. Inspiring Scotland is the delivery partner for the CashBack for Communities programme, appointed in July 2012.

- CashBack invests monies seized from criminals under the Proceeds of Crime Act 2002 back into our communities.
- Since 2008 the Scottish Government has committed £92 million to CashBack / community initiatives, funding community activities and facilities largely, but not exclusively, for young people.
- CashBack supports all 32 Local Authorities across Scotland.
- Sporting and recreational activities / culture / mentoring and employability / community projects.
- CashBack has delivered nearly 2 million activities and opportunities for young people.
- Phase 3 of CashBack runs to end March 2017 and is focused on positive outcomes for young people.



CashBack for Communities: Aims

CashBack activities:

- Use the proceeds of crime in a positive way to expand young people's horizons and increase their opportunities to develop their interests and skills in an enjoyable, fulfilling and supportive way.
- Are open, where possible, to all children and young people, while focusing resources in those communities suffering most from antisocial behaviour and crime.
- Seek to increase levels of participation to help divert young people away from 'at risk' behaviour, and will aim to increase the positive long-term outcomes for those who take part.

It should be noted that CashBack partners may have worked with some of the same young people over a number of years. Therefore the total annual activity and opportunity figures might not directly correlate to the number of individual young people who have been involved with CashBack.

The **Small Grants Scheme** exists to support local volunteer led youth groups and a number of these have been funded through the CashBack programme in Midlothian including Scouts, Boys Brigade at Bonnyrigg and Cheery Road Activity club at Gorebridge.

YouthLink Scotland, through the Youth Work Fund, has supported capacity of young people and youth work organisations. Examples in the Local Authority include Penicuik YMCA, Newbattle Community Learning KWP project, and Gorebridge Opportunities (GO).

Prince's Trust Development Awards have been used to support a number of young people in the area including funding towards completing Security Industry Authority licences and Sports Coaching qualifications.

Basketballscotland has supported 2 grassroots basketball clubs in the area, at St David's RC school and Newbattle HS as well as running coaching and broad participation programmes for young people.

Scottish FA runs a School of Football initiative with Newbattle HS which was one of first of 26 schools running the project across Scotland. A social and academic programme, the pupils involved receive 1 hour per day activities within their curriculum. The SFA also manages the Midnight League programme which has activities at Penicuik Park, Poltonhall Astro and Newbattle High School.

Scottish Rugby Union has part funded 1 full time rugby Development Officers at Lasswade RFC and one at Midlothian Council who are responsible for delivery of broad participation programme. The street rugby activities have been run in Gorebridge, Newtongrange and Penicuik.



Midlothian – CashBack Outcomes: Case Studies

CashBack has made a huge difference to the lives of young people. We have captured information on individual case studies for CashBack partners which demonstrate the impact delivery activities have had to those participating. The CashBack funded **Ocean Youth Trust** 5 day voyages in May provided 10 young people with a unique opportunity to learn new skills and meet friends. The feedback was overwhelmingly positive.

J "This has been an amazing experience for me. I feel so much more confident and mature. After the week on the boat, I feel there's no problem I can't handle."

J "Completing this voyage with all its ups and down is better than anything I have ever done in my life. We all became like a family, the first family I have ever had! And the great thing is I will be taking these friendships with me off the boat. We have already exchanged numbers and will definitely stay in touch."

B "This programme has been an eye opener to so many things – I have learnt lots of new things from sailing to cooking and making new friends. My outlook on life has changed and this voyage has made me feel alive and healthy."

Each of the young people was supported and completed the following national qualifications: -SQA Core Skills Unit (Level 3) in Listening, Speaking and Working with Others -Duke of Edinburgh's Award Gold Residential -Royal Yachting Association Start Yachting Certificate

D was a pupil at Newbattle High School and was involved in the Scottish Football Association **School of Football programme** in 2008. He has overcome various difficulties but was inspired by the programme. Since his involvement in the programme, he still finds time to volunteer/assist local Scottish FA community coaches deliver holiday camps, centre sessions and promoting and assisting at his local Midnight League venue. He hands out flyers, set up pitches, takes registration. He has also found time to attend Scottish FA Coach Education Courses and has achieved various coaching qualifications through CashBack funding.

D won the Volunteer of the Year Award at the Midlothian Council Annual Sports Awards. The School of Football had helped build Darren's confidence and organisational skills as well as improve his approach and attendance at school.
