About CashBack for Communities

CashBack for Communities is a Scottish Government programme which takes funds recovered from the proceeds of crime and invests them into free activities and programmes for young people across Scotland. Inspiring Scotland is the delivery partner for the CashBack for Communities programme, appointed in July 2012.

- CashBack invests monies seized from criminals under the Proceeds of Crime Act 2002 back into our communities.
- Since 2008 the Scottish Government has committed £92 million to CashBack / community initiatives, funding community activities and facilities largely, but not exclusively, for young people.
- CashBack supports all 32 Local Authorities across Scotland.
- Sporting and recreational activities / culture / mentoring and employability / community projects.
- CashBack has delivered nearly 2 million activities and opportunities for young people.
- Phase 3 of CashBack runs to end March 2017 and is focused on positive outcomes for young people.



CashBack for Communities: Aims

CashBack activities:

- Use the proceeds of crime in a positive way to expand young people's horizons and increase their opportunities to develop their interests and skills in an enjoyable, fulfilling and supportive way.
- Are open, where possible, to all children and young people, while focusing resources in those communities suffering most from antisocial behaviour and crime.
- Seek to increase levels of participation to help divert young people away from 'at risk' behaviour, and will aim to increase the positive long-term outcomes for those who take part.

Activity number represents the number of activities and opportunities that young people have taken advantage of as a result of CashBack funding. It should be noted that CashBack partners may have worked with some of the same young people over a number of years. Therefore the total annual activity and opportunity figures might not directly correlate to the number of individual young people who have been involved with CashBack.

The Small Grants Scheme consortium has been a beneficiary of CashBack funding in Renfrew since 2008 and this has included supporting Scouts, Girlguiding, Girls Brigade, Boys Brigade, Youth Scotland and Youth Club activities across the area.

YouthLink Scotland, through the Youth Work Fund, has supported capacity of young people and youth work organisations. Examples in the Local Authority include Ocean Youth Trust, Renfrew YMCA, Play the Game, and LGBT Youth Scotland.

Basketballpaisley supported by **basketballscotland** West Regional Development team who organised coaching within local schools and then organise school festivals which attracts over 400 players from the area.

Prince's Trust Development Awards have been used to support a number of young people in the area including funding HGV License courses, educational services, and alternative therapy courses.

The Scottish FA currently operate 2 Schools of Football at Renfrew High and Castlehead High operating 2 year groups and have also developed an accreditation course 'Developing Individual Performance in Sport' (SCQF 5) for the young people to progress through. Quality Mark Clubs which have benefited from the focussed approach to female volunteer recruitment in St Peters Football Club (Renfrewshire) and Port Glasgow Juniors (Inverclyde). SFA also have an active Equity project in North Lanarkshire with participation centres already set up and engaging ethnic minorities such as African, Muslim, Congolese and Polish through strong links with local clubs. SFA has also run the Midnight League programme in the Authority at Ferguslie Park, Renfrew High and Glennifer High, where Street Football sessions have also been held.

Scottish Rugby Union runs broad participation activities in Renfrewshire and CashBack funding is used to part-fund one full-time rugby club development officers at Renfrewshire Council. This post is responsible for the delivery of the broad participation programme and street rugby in the area. Paisley Grammar has been a School of Rugby since where pupils take part in up to 5 sessions per week of rugby training and classroom based sessions, augmented by values workshops. In 2012 Paisley RFC were awarded a grant from the CashBack Rugby Facilities Fund for the redevelopment of a number of the club's facilities including new floodlighting.



Renfrewshire – CashBack Outcomes: Case Studies

CashBack has made a huge difference to the lives of young people. We have captured information on individual case studies for CashBack partners which demonstrate the impact delivery activities have had to those participating. R has become key in the delivery of multiple basketball activities in the west of Scotland. He coaches the Renfrewshire Wheelchair Basketball Club. R is using basketball to give as much back to the community as possible. "Basketball has provided me with multiple opportunities to volunteer, coach and play. I have been given these opportunities to gain further skills. I got my First Aid qualification and coaching qualifications UKCC level 1 and 2 all funded through the CashBack programme. In additional I gained the Wheelchair Basketball Leadership Award." These development opportunities afforded to R have had a positive impact both on the sport but also the community at large. R plans to extend this support by attending the Coaches Apprenticeship Programme which will take his skill and knowledge to another level. His parents can also see the impact basketball has had on R's life "it has given R the chance to stay fit and healthy and play as part of a team environment. Coaching has also taught him new skills and these experiences are bound to stand him in good stead for the future".

DS was part of the S1 intake for the Scottish FA's School of Football initiative. He started out very quiet and within himself. His first couple of weeks at high school he was isolated from having any particular peer group of friends. Through the School of Football, David has been able to network with new people and peers from his primary school. Having the security of the School of Football has allowed David to be more expressive not only in his self socially, but as a footballer. David is now excelling and progressing well in the school of football. During the Classroom sessions, David now engages in discussion and debate within small groups and sometimes to the whole class. Out with the School of Football sessions, David has now joined a lunchtime club and has begun to increase his confidence and social skills with his peers in a different environment. At times, he returns to his old self of being quiet and within himself, however, he is working hard and improvements are evident already.

Project Name	DescriptionThe purpose of CashBack for Creativity is to provide access to high quality experiential opportunities in all arts forms via three routes: (i) an Open Arts Fund for small grant awards of up to £10k for youth arts groups; (ii) a Strategic Fund for larger arts groups who focus on young engagement and employability; and (iii) a training and education route through College networks looking at engaging young people in vital skills required for the textile and arts sectors.Funding rounds take place annually. Create Paisley - 20 20	Will equip and resource twenty 12-19 year olds to create twenty 1-minute video journalistic productions (hence the name 20 20) showcasing local Paisley and Renfrewshire artists (bands, DJs, painters, dancers, songwriters, street artists etc). Create Paisley will recruit young people who face significant challenges and have a lack of real opportunities to redefine their future. The project will equip these young aspiring producers through professionally delivered workshops in filmmaking, production planning and editing. We will see young people grow in confidence throughout the project; developing skills and abilities which were previously unattainable. During the process, they will learn both time and resource management, and gain confidence to process and deal with often chaotic lifestyles. The project will also help develop soft skills like teamwork, communication, as well as solid skills like audio recording, filmmaking skills, videography, directing, etc. This will allow young people opportunity to progress in life, into further education, employment and access further pathways which are signposted. Kibble Education and Care Centre	Offers arts workshops in collaboration with Who Cares? Scotland with the support of Creative Scotland. The classes run during the summer break and offer visual arts, free running and music. Visual arts classes include mural painting, canvas painting, t-shirt design, decoupage and other activities organised in consultation with the young people who sign up for the programme. Free running classes will benefit from a tutor who has built positive relationships with young people and has demonstrated an ability to inspire looked after young people, with one young person currently looking into the possibility of becoming a qualified free running tutor himself. The music classes will include taster sessions on a variety of instruments, including guitar and percussion, with the option for young people to pursue the instrument that most appeals to them. The main live performance will be staged in a town centre venue, to young people and youth workers/teachers. In addition to a live drama, there will be some short films, projections and photography combined into the performance to utilise the multi-media skills that young people are developing and using in their everyday lives.
