About CashBack for Communities

CashBack for Communities is a Scottish Government programme which takes funds recovered from the proceeds of crime and invests them into free activities and programmes for young people across Scotland. Inspiring Scotland is the delivery partner for the CashBack for Communities programme, appointed in July 2012.

- CashBack invests monies seized from criminals under the Proceeds of Crime Act 2002 back into our communities.
- Since 2008 the Scottish Government has committed £92 million to CashBack / community initiatives, funding community activities and facilities largely, but not exclusively, for young people.
- CashBack supports all 32 Local Authorities across Scotland.
- Sporting and recreational activities / culture / mentoring and employability / community projects.
- CashBack has delivered nearly 2 million activities and opportunities for young people.
- Phase 3 of CashBack runs to end March 2017 and is focused on positive outcomes for young people.



CashBack for Communities: Aims

CashBack activities:

- Use the proceeds of crime in a positive way to expand young people's horizons and increase their opportunities to develop their interests and skills in an enjoyable, fulfilling and supportive way.
- Are open, where possible, to all children and young people, while focusing resources in those communities suffering most from antisocial behaviour and crime.
- Seek to increase levels of participation to help divert young people away from 'at risk' behaviour, and will aim to increase the positive long-term outcomes for those who take part.

Therefore the total annual activity and opportunity figures might not directly correlate to the number of individual young people who have been involved with CashBack.

The **Small Grants Scheme** consortium has been a beneficiary of CashBack funding in Stirling since 2008 and this has included supporting Boys Brigade, Girlguiding Scotland, Scouts Scotland and Clubs for Young People activities across the area.

YouthLink Scotland, through the Youth Work Fund, has supported capacity of young people and youth work organisations. Examples in the Local Authority include Exit Youth Group, The Rock Community Project, LGBT Youth Scotland, and Active Stirling.

Creative Scotland, through their CashBack for Creativity fund, has supported organisations in the area including Tolbooth.

Amateur Boxing Scotland provided support and coaching facilities to young people in the area from 2012 to 2014 at Manor Farm, Stirling Business Park.

Basketballscotland has supported a number of clubs in the area, including Stirling Knights and Clacks Wasps providing coaching assistance and organising activities and courses for young people in the area as well as providing coaching support through the School of Basketball activities at Wallace High School.

Scottish FA runs a School of Football initiative at Wallace High School as one of 26 across Scotland. A social and academic programme, the 32 pupils involved receive 1 hour per day activities within their curriculum. The SFA also manages the Midnight League programme which has activity provided at Forthbank Stadium on Friday nights and also Street Football where the SFA has supported local clubs in delivering programmes in Muga Park Cornton, Stirling High School, Muga Park Plean, Bannockburn and Stirling HS's.

Scottish Rugby Union runs broad participation in Stirling and the CashBack funding has enabled part funding of 1 full time rugby Development Officer at Stirling County and Active Stirling. Wallace Academy has been a School of Rugby since 2011 involving nearly 30 young people in S1 and S2. In 2012 McLaren RFC were awarded funding from CashBack to develop their pitch and training area.

Scottish Sports Futures have completed a number of years of CashBack funded delivery at Raploch Community Campus which has attracted young people from across Stirling and surrounding areas. Jump2lt, the programme which provides interactive primary school health and citizenship programme, has been very active in Stirling including Bannockburn, Cornton, St Mary's, Cowie, Our Lady's, Borestone, Fallin, Raploch and East Plean Primary Schools.



Stirling – CashBack Outcomes: Case Studies

CashBack has made a huge difference to the lives of young people. We have captured information on individual case studies for CashBack partners which demonstrate the impact delivery activities have had to those participating. P moved to Scotland from Ghana in 2003 aged 10. After joining his local **Shell Twilight Basketball** session, he quickly became one of the leaders within the group and as his confidence grew so did his ambition to develop as a coach. "I struggled at school and didn't do well with exams. I think learning in the basketball environment helped with my confidence and made it easier." The TBB Co-ordinator, Ross Hutton identified this and supported P to gain his coaching qualification. P then volunteered at the TBB session in Stirling and ran some extra coaching in his local community before joining the TBB staff on a permanent basis. P has stated on numerous occasions that this experience helped him gain his now full time position with Glasgow Sport as a Basketball Coach. "I got a lot from Twilight basketball and securing a career in sport is the next big step'. Ross Hutton TBB Coordinator and mentor, "Twilight Basketball has become a huge part of P's life. Since then he has taken part in the programme and graduated to become one of the most inspiring role model's the programme has, as part of the coaching staff. I have witnessed P grow from being a quiet young boy to a very confident and driven young man."

The Scottish Football Association's Girls and Women's programme has been working hard to use football as a tool to engage with young girls who may be at risk from difficult social situations. A young girl 'C' was unfortunately subject to bullying at her school which culminated in her being admitted to hospital due to weight loss. This resulted in a series of anxiety attacks along with very low self-esteem.

C had struggled to make friends until she joined her local girls' football club, where the interaction with other girls her age has allowed her to feel accepted by peers for the first time in several years. Club and Scottish FA staff were made aware of C's difficulties and because of the CashBack for Communities funding of the Development Officer, were able to help at her at every opportunity to participate as fully as possible in club and regional activities. Following two years of support, C is no longer required to regularly visit the hospital to monitor her weight. This year she attended the SFA's girls' holiday football camp, which was a real milestone in her improvement as C has previously been unable to stay any length of time away from home. Her improved mental state has been mirrored with success on the pitch and C attended the National Camp weekend; something which she would certainly not have managed just two years ago.

Schools of Rugby	 School of Rugby aims to place rugby at the centre of school life, providing pupils in S1-2 with additional opportunities to focus on the sport, receiving up to 5 sessions per week during curricular and extra-curricular times. Pupils are tested throughout the year to assess improvements in core rugby skills; physical competence; and their behaviour and performance in school generally. Rugby is also used as a context for learning and a theme for cross-curricular projects, values workshops, visits to professional rugby environments etc. Wallace High School have been a Schools of Rugby since 2011. The programme is delivered by PE Teacher Chris Jubb with support from Eric Urqhart. 31 pupils take part in up to 5 sessions per week of rugby training and classroom based sessions. Pupils' behaviour is monitored as is their skill development and physical competence. The school has provided evidence on the impact the programme is having on some challenging and disengaged young people, as well as growth of rugby participation throughout the school. In particular ETC will nurture a deeper understanding of the developmental value of sport and physical activity when working with often challenging young people with varying needs and interests. Training, with complementary resources, will equip staff with the skills, understanding and confidence to deliver activities effectively to a range of young people in a variety of settings. Training is delivered either as a one off or at times over a series of dates for more than one module delivery. Dynamic Youth Awards and Community Achievement Awards are also undertaken by young people at sessions to reward their contributions and personal development. Significant input from Stirling youth services adds great value to the session and its participants.
